HAW 201 : Intermediate Hawaiian I

Credits: 4

Class Hours: 4 lecture

Prerequisites: "C" or higher in HAW 102.

Description: This course is a continuation of HAW 102, focusing on further development of the five recognized skills of language acquisition: listening, speaking, reading, writing, and cultural understanding in the Hawaiian language. Students will gain these five skills, attaining the Intermediate Low level of the ACTFL proficiency scale. **Semester Offered:** Fall, Spring

Course Student Learning Outcomes (CSLOs):

- 1. Communicate orally in Hawaiian at an ACTFL intermediate low level.
- 2. Demonstrate practices and perspectives of Hawaiian culture.
- 3. Produce and interpret written Hawaiian at an ACTFL intermediate low level.
- 4. Demonstrate an understanding of the grammatical and structural aspects of Hawaiian.
- 5. Apply and interpret vocabulary and other language skills that integrate work, school, family, 'āina, and language in real life applications.
