NURS 211: Professionalism in Nursing I

Admission into the Career Ladder Nursing Program. Approval of instructor.

Corequisite Courses: NURS 210

Description:

This first level course focuses on the history of nursing practice and education. Ethical and legal aspects as well as professional responsibilities in the practice of nursing are emphasized. In addition, an introduction to the professional standards of nursing are presented.

- 1. Demonstrate the professional behaviors reflected in the ANA Code of Ethics and state standards of practice.
- 2. Distinguish the legitimate sources of evidence for professional decision-making.
- 3. Discuss the leadership responsibility of the nurse in the political process as it impacts health care and health care planning.
- 4. Identify historical events as well as nursing and national issues that contribute to the development of standards of practice for the nurse.
- 5. Describe options for individuals in accessing either allopathic or integrative health care in the U.S. health care delivery system.
- 6. Discuss the legal and ethical responsibility for delivering client-centered care in promoting health care across the lifespan.
